This is the Sacramento Iris Society's two-day sale of recently dug iris rhizomes.

Hundreds of varieties will be available. Each specimen will be labeled with the cultivar name and a description of the flower appearance. Again, we will have a large selection of rebloomers, which have an extended bloom season.

A demonstration table will be set up to show how rhizomes should be planted. A labeling station will allow you to prepare a free permanent garden label for each of your rhizome purchases before you leave.

Remember that irises are both deer and drought resistant which makes them ideal additions to your garden.

Make Plans for Fall Planting at Shepard

Fall is a great time to be digging holes and planting new plants. The roots can develop over the cool months and the plants will spring into action in the ... well, Spring!

The Perimeter Project is a way for clubs to display their gardening skills by designing and maintaining one of the beds that are immediately outside the Shepard Center. Many dedicated clubs are already involved in this effort, and their gardens are looking beautiful: the beds that face McKinley Blvd., and most of the borders facing west and south, are maintained by the River Park Garden Club. The Japanese Garden is maintained by the American Bonsai Association of Sacramento, the Cactus and Succulent Garden is maintained by that society, the Pollinator Garden is maintained by the Perennial Plant Club, and the Iris beds (facing the parking lot) are maintained by the Sacramento Iris Society.

But your club can still get in on the Perimeter Project! Below are some photos of garden spaces that remain unclaimed:

- 1. Nice painted fence backdrop, right side of the beautiful gate that we enter from the parking lot. This garden was previously maintained by the Geranium club, so some plants remain. Gets afternoon sun. size: 20' x 1½' approx.
- 2. Outside the entrance hall, facing east: a large garden spot with some established azaleas and other plants. Could be beautiful to look at from inside the building. Gets morning sun. size: 14½' x 35'.
- 3. West side of stone wall that defines the McKinley Blvd. entrance to the building. Gets a lot of shade from a huge redwood tree. size: 7' x 22' approx.

Your garden will have a sign that identifies your club and the year you began. This is an opportunity to make a contribution to our community and showcase your particular family of plants and how they fit into our climate.
