**CLEAN-UP DAY SUCCESS**

On Saturday, September 30, 2017, thirty-two volunteers participated in the "Clean-Up the Shepard" event at the Shepard Garden and Arts Center. The participants worked tirelessly from 8:00 AM to 12:00 noon. Members of Ikebana International and Bonsai Club were carefully pruning and trimming trees and bushes in the Japanese Garden, while Native Plant Society, Perennial Plant Club, and River Park Garden Club painted benches, swept, cleaned, and weeded the gardens. Diligent workers from the Rose Society, Weavers and Spinners, and Textile Arts wiped down curtains, windows, and cabinets. The sculptures over the fireplaces were carefully cleaned and duster by Gypsy Trader members while Floral Design and Sogetsu members cleaned all the folding tables located in various rooms and closets at the Center. Repairs

to tables and chairs were completed by members of the Clock and Watch Collectors. A dilapidated rolling cart was replaced by a new, bright red cart and a coat rack was assembled. Cobwebs and gardens were tended to by Cactus and Succulent Society members and fresh mulch was spread around the camellia trees. Several members cleaned the kitchen, scrubbing the interiors, exteriors of the cabinets,


