Bare Ground and Tangles

The Shepard Garden and Arts Center is a beautiful building, especially on the inside, with its high clerestory windows admitting lots of light and its views of the patio gardens on the east and north sides. These gardens are nicely maintained by our own club members.

But what about the Shepard Center's appearance from the streets, its "curb appeal?" Does it look like a place that nurtures *Gardening and* the *Arts*? The city's budget for parks is very limited these days. The gardens on the *outside* of the walls, especially those near the entrance on the McKinley Blvd. side and on the east side, which were at one time cared for by members of the clubs, are frankly, a mess. Ivy and weeds engulf the camelias and azaleas; some areas have bare ground, others are filled with Bermuda grass.

What can be done about this? Noelle Anderson (nandersn@surewest.net), who works with the Perennial Plant Club, the Board of SG&AC and the Friends of SG&AC, is looking to revive the practice of having the clubs maintain sections of the gardens around the perimeter of the building. We could call it the Perimeter Project.

The city has fixed the leaks in the sprinkler system and it is functioning, although we may need to refine it to suit the needs of different kinds of plants. Some of the existing land-scaping just needs a tune-up. There are healthy camelias







and azaleas and some irises (Siberian, maybe). Clubs could ask for funds from the Friends of SG&AC to pay for plants, mulch, improvements to the irrigation system, and a plaque identifying their club.

The advantages of the "Perimeter Project" to our Garden and Arts Center are these:

- Better curb appeal perhaps get more outside rentals, and a more positive image in the community
- A venue for clubs to show off their gardening skills and get new members
- Gardening education for the community



How can you get involved? We will be sending out a letter to all the club Presidents inviting them or their representatives to an organizational meeting at the Shepard Center on Saturday, August 18, at 9:00 a.m. In the meantime, although everyone is either frantically busy or trying to relax, please email Noelle at nandersn@surewest.net with any and all of your ideas.






Bromeliad and Carnivorous Plant Sale
