

CEILING CLEARANCE

The Sacramento Fire Department has stated we are in violation of their code if we have materials stacked above the cabinets more than two feet from the ceiling. A rope tied at the correct height indicates the boundary. All black risers are to be stacked under the sink in the utility room. Please do not place anything within this clearance area.

WALK THROUGH CHECKLIST

The Shepard Board implemented a new procedure for clubs in September 2019, called the "Walk Through Checklist". The monitor greets the club at the beginning of the scheduled time in and has the Checklist signed and dated by a club representative. At the close of the event, the monitor and the club representative do a quick walk-through of the facility and sign "time-out". The walk-through procedure will not be counted as overtime by the monitor. The Treasurer of the Shepard will collect these Walk Through Checklists at the end of each calendar month. He will use them to determine if there are any overtime charges or penalty fees (for not leaving the facility clean). This signed document is agreed upon by the monitor and the club representative. It is the clubs' insurance that they are not incurring any charges they are unaware of.

COMMUNICATION AND SCHEDULING

The 'Shepard Communication Committee' includes members from 5 different clubs who are working together to facilitate better communication between the Shepard Board and member clubs. They are also working on policies and procedures to streamline communication between clubs and the Shepard Scheduling Monitor. In September 2019, the committee determined its number one goal was to use the website on-line calendar for use by the Scheduling monitor. At the Shepard Board meeting on October 7, 2019, the Board voted upon a motion to implement the single calendar. The Scheduling Monitor will input the schedule on-line rather than keep a paper schedule in a binder in the Shepard office. When clubs wish to add, change, or delete an event, they are to email contact the Scheduling Monitor. She will make the change on the on-line calendar. Clubs should use the calendar to check their event date and time. If the calendar is incorrect, they should email the Scheduling monitor (ShepardGACinfo@att.net) to make the correction.

Three Garden spaces left in the Perimeter Project

If you walk around the Shepard Center, you'll see that the Cactus and Succulent Society, the Perennial Plant Club, the River Park Garden Club, the Geranium Club, the Iris Society, and the Bonsai Association (American) are doing a wonderful job of maintaining their garden spaces, and new signs are up to recognize and promote their work. The Perennial Plant Club even got a new member because she saw their garden as she was passing by!

There are three garden spaces still available to other clubs. One is in a very visible place, outside the entrance on McKinley Boulevard, with a beautiful rock wall as a backdrop. It has a few plantings already which you could replace if you wish. It is west-facing but shaded by a very large evergreen tree (picture 1).


The second garden is larger and could be magnificent when viewed from inside the hall where the restrooms are. It is east-facing and gets some nice morning sun. It also has some plantings which you could keep or replace as you wish (picture 2).

The third is the long garden at the east-end of the building. Last fall a team of volunteers worked very hard getting rid of all the ivy, the weed shrubs, and trash left by the homeless, and then putting down cardboard and wood chip mulch. At the recent cleanup day, it was an easy task to tidy it up again. It has large and healthy camellias which we would like to keep, but there is space in front of the camellias for some shade-loving plants (bottom picture).
