

If you love indigo like millions of people around the world, maybe it's time to try your hand at achieving your favorite shade of blue or trendy shibori pattern. But setting up your own vat can be difficult. So we are inviting community members to join us for our first annual Indigo Dip Dye Day. We will do the hard work for you. Put June 13 on your calendar and start looking for things you would like to dip in our vats.

The Sacramento Center for Textile Arts (SCTA) will set up several vats on the Shepard Garden & Arts Center patio. For a nominal fee (\$10), you can dip your items to make them your favorite shade of blue. Some of our members will be on hand to help you get started. Items to be dyed should be well-washed and natural fibers (cotton, linen or wool). Please, no item larger than an adult-sized T-shirt as the vats are just 5 gallons in size. Items do not have to be new or in perfect condition. They don't even have to start out white. Pale colors dye well too. (And the dye can hide stains.) T-shirts, baby onesies, napkins, pillow cases, or fat quarters of quilting cotton would be perfect beginner projects.
