BOARD UPDATES

having decided that minutes of future Board meetings will not be read aloud after August 4, but will instead be approved by e-mail to Board members prior to the meeting. Minutes of July 28 were not available at the August 4 regular Board meeting.

The Board voted on August 4 to purchase a new projector for the Main Room at a cost of nearly \$8,000. Participants in the discussion clarified the machine's capabilities, so the Board was comfortable approving the purchase. If arrangements with the City change to require the new projector be removed, it will continue to belong to the Board, and will not become City property.

At the September 2 Directors-only meeting the Board plans to approve an updated club manual for printing and distribution at the in-person September 8 regular Board meeting.
